Showground Information

- A. All vehicles dropping off and picking up exhibits must enter by the back gate No 4 (see map in Schedule).
- B. Entry tickets can be pre-purchased online (go to **Buy Tickets** at www.mtlarcomshow.com.au). Exhibitors dropping off and picking up exhibits can enter the grounds without a ticket, with proof of exhibit entry.
- C. Camping sites are available through the MLDSS (subject to availability) and can be pre-purchased online (go to **Buy Tickets** at www.mtlarcomshow.com.au). Shower and toilet facilities are also available. Power is limited. Campers must understand that they are camping at their own risk and the MLDSS takes no responsibility for their belongings.
- D. Access to the Caged Birds Section shed for exhibitors will not be permitted outside of opening hours without permission from the Section Manager. A caretaker will stay overnight in the Caged Birds Section shed to monitor birds who are remaining to be exhibited over both Saturday and Sunday.

General Regulations

- A. The Mount Larcom & District Show Society Inc (MLDSS) is affiliated with the Queensland Chamber of Agricultural Societies Inc (Queensland Ag Shows) and as such, follows its Constitution, Regulations and Rules. The attention of exhibitors is drawn to the fact that all entries are subject to the Rules, By-Laws and Regulations of the Queensland Ag Shows and the MLDSS, as well as the Regulations pertaining to the Caged Birds Section.

- B. Where there is conflict between the Queensland Ag Shows General Regulations and the MLDSS Regulations, those of the MLDSS will prevail, including:
 - 1.1.19 *Any uncollected item must be removed from the Show precinct within seven (7) days of the event otherwise it will be forfeited.*
 - 1.11.2 *The information an exhibitor provides on the application for entry will not determine whether GST is applicable on prize money. It is up to the exhibitor who is registered for GST and is entering their exhibit as part of their business enterprise, to advise this when entering.*
 - 1.12.2 *All cash prizes and trophies must be claimed within three (3) weeks from the closing date of the show. Prizes not claimed will be considered to have lapsed and the amount will become a donation to the Society.*
 - 1.13.1 *(e) A protest against a Judge's Award must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50.*

Caged Birds Section Regulations

- A. Each individual exhibitor of protected species of Native Birds must hold a current permit to keep fauna, or a current Aviculturist Licence, and must be covered by a current Movement Authority, as issued by the Queensland Parks & Wildlife Service, and must be able to provide evidence of same on request.
- B. All birds are to be free of lice and any infectious or contagious disease. Any exhibit, which in the opinion of the Section Manager, is found to be in an unfit state to be exhibited, must be moved to a quarantine area or collected by the owner immediately.
- C. Cages should be in a neat and clean condition, free of faecal and feather contamination. Any cages deemed unsuitable for the welfare or the contamination of birds will not be permitted.
- D. Food and water must be made available for all exhibits. Exhibitors are expected to supply their own food.
- E. Birds are not required to be ringed.
- F. The Society may receive any bird for display only and will be marked accordingly.

Conditions of Entry

- A. **All entries close at 5:00pm Sunday, 14 June.** No late entries will be accepted.
- B. Entries must be completed on the Entry Form and emailed to **cagedbirds@mtlarcomshow.com.au** before the allotted time. A Word version of the Entry Form can be requested if you prefer to complete the form electronically.
- C. Entry fee is \$1.00 per exhibit (cash only), paid to the Section Manager **before 8:00am Saturday, 20 June.**
- D. Junior Handler is open to children aged 15 years and under, with an exhibit entered. Refer to *Junior Handler Conditions of Entry*.
- E. Cage stickers are to be placed on the bottom left side of cage when facing cage.
- F. **Benching time is 7:00am Saturday.** Birds will not be accepted after 8:00am. **Judging commences 8:30am sharp.**
- G. **Release time is 5:00pm Saturday.** Exhibitors are encouraged to keep their birds exhibited over the whole two days (Sunday release time 1:00pm). Early release under special circumstances can be discussed with Section Manager.

Conditions of entry

- A. Exhibitors aged 15 years or younger can choose to nominate as *Junior Handlers*.
- B. To nominate as a Junior Handler, the "I am a Junior Handler" box must be ticked on the Exhibitor's entry form, with the Exhibitor's age provided.
- C. Junior Handlers are subject to the *General Regulations* and *Caged Birds Section Regulations*.
- D. The total Junior Handler prize money pool is \$60, which will be equally distributed amongst ALL Junior Handler Exhibitors who enter, in lieu of First Place and Second Place prize money.
- E. Junior Handler exhibits will be judged separately from the Adult exhibits.
- F. The Section Best winner will receive the *Junior Handler Section Best* trophy, rosette and prize money, in addition to their equal portion of the Junior Handler \$60 prize money pool.
- G. The Junior Handler section is excluded from Champion and Grand Champion judging.

Caged Birds Sale • Saturday 20 June 2025

The Caged Birds Section will have **caged birds available for sale to the public** after judging has been completed on Saturday (until sold out). Numbers and varieties available will depend on sale nominations.

To nominate birds for sale, please contact the Section Manager before Friday, 19 June

No poultry. Cash transactions only (no EFTPOS available). Small transport boxes may be available on the day; it is recommended you bring your own suitable transport box/cage. No sales are to be advertised/conducted until after judging has been completed. Transfer of birds should be conducted in a secure area to avoid escape. The Mt Larcom & District Show Society Inc and the Caged Birds Section will not be held responsible for any sale birds (including escape, injury, death or physical condition). Sale birds will be inspected for health and wellbeing; the Section Manager reserves the right to remove any birds from sale if necessary. Bird sellers are responsible for the sale of their own birds and must remain in or near the sale area (or nominate a proxy). Sellers/buyers must abide by any Qld licensing requirements. All transactions, guarantees and liability are between the seller and the buyer. All sales are final.

Caged Birds Program • Sunday 21 June 2025

The Caged Birds Section will remain open on Sunday for display (no judging).

Exhibitors are encouraged to keep their birds exhibited over the whole weekend, with release time on Sunday after 1:00pm (early release can be discussed with the Section Manager)



The **Caged Birds Section** is located in the shed across from the woodchop area, towards the back of the showgrounds, as shown below (red circle)



**No vehicle entry will be available for exhibitors through the main gate (off The Narrows Rd)
Entry/exit times will be restricted for safety reasons**

If **walking in** to drop off or pick up your birds, turn left after the railway crossing, park on the oval and enter through the back gate entry, as shown above (orange solid line/circle).

If **driving in** to drop off or pick up your birds, turn left after the railway crossing, continue past the oval to the end of Popenia Rd, turn right and follow the signs to Gate 4 entry, as shown above (yellow dotted line). Exhibitor's vehicles cannot remain at the Caged Birds Shed area and must be removed before 8:00am. There may be parking available outside the gate (see car in yellow circle).
