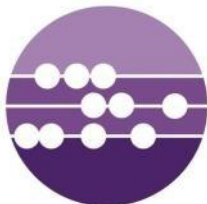

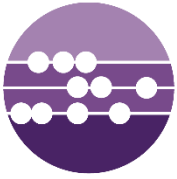

1. No late or phone nominations accepted.
2. Exhibits must be bona fide work of the exhibitor.
3. Exhibits must not have been entered in a previous Mt Larcom Show.
4. Exhibits must have been made or finished in the last 2 years.
5. Each exhibit cannot compete in more than one class.
6. Exhibits must comply with each sections extra conditions.
7. Entry forms must be completed, signed lodged and paid by section closing times.
8. The Society will not be responsible for any loss or accident caused through or by the exhibit and will not under any circumstances be held responsible for any loss or wrong delivery of exhibit or any kind of damage done thereto.
9. The Society reserves the right to refuse any entry.
10. The Society may receive any item for display only.
11. There can be no switching of a nomination, by exhibitor, after it is lodged unless a genuine mistake has been made.
12. Any exhibit found suffering from disease or parasites can and will be removed.
13. No awards except such provided by the Society shall be placed on exhibits.
